## 1. What do you want to do? Summarise your project. (Max 200 words)

If successful, we would use the funding in 3 ways.

Firstly, we would purchase equipment that we do not currently have which will allow us to run our provisions with more efficiency and ease. We will further ensure that the equipment purchased is more cost effective when running and energy friendly keeping in line with east Lothian climate change strategy and further reflects are plan section 2:2.

Secondly, we will use the money towards food costs for Pennypit deliveries, this allow us to provide 50 2 course meals weekly to our service users. This is essential in reducing food insecurities and social isolation within the community of Prestonpans which links in with the area plan section 3:1 and 3:2.

Thirdly, we will use the money to provide a volunteer staff training and well-being day for the volunteers who work on our provisions. Without our volunteers our services would not be able to run as efficiently and smoothly which aligns area plan outcome 1:1.

#### 2. What difference do you want to make? E.g. (example) (Max 200 words)

As a befriending service the primary difference we wish to make in the community is to enhance the quality of life for those who experience social isolation and loneliness. We further aim to work towards reducing food poverty and insecurity by providing access to hot meals and safe spaces. We further aim to improve mental and physical well-being by providing access to nutritious meals, exercise and interaction.

We want to promote independence and quality of life for our service users by offering lifts and opportunities for them to get out and about within the community. This in term gives support to their caregivers and families by providing an opportunity of respite for them while their families are at our provisions.

We will improve local partnerships within the community and build and encourage strong community connections. We further aim to improve intergenerational connection within the community by offering voluntary opportunities and work experience to young adults within the community. Furthermore offering access back into the world of work and provide low pressure opportunity's for volunteers.

We have seen the effects that these services have had and the need for them is still paramount to the development within our community. We have seen a variety of individuals from different backgrounds massively improve mentally from these services, those who were very reluctant to socialise now jump at any opportunity offered locally and assist in encouraging, welcoming and socialising with others who are slightly struggling. This funding will allow us it continue to deliver these vital projects and make the running more efficient and cost effective while supporting our volunteers.

#### 5. Who do you want to help?

Our Projects focuses on working with the elderly members within the community.

We run 5 Projects over the week. Time for tea has on average 20 members weekly. Walking football on a Tuesday works with on average 25 men. Lunch with the Bunch on a Thursday has on average 40 participants. Finally, on a Pennypit Deliveries we provide meals to 50 service users.

We will ensure that the proposal reaches those in the community that need it the most through preexisting links within our community. These links are with GPs, Occupational therapists, and community link workers where they identify and refer to members of the community who would benefit from help that we provide through our services and programs. These projects allow us to relieve the pressure off our service users' families by offering respite while they are at our provisions. We also support volunteers to feel a sense of self-worth and give them some responsibility and confidence.
