# Empowerment The broad aim of this pillar is the empowerment of families and carers to enforce the rights of neurodivergent children, including within the education system. Specifically we aim to advocate for the rights of neurodivergent (or potentially neurodivergent) children and their parents, family and carers, and educate them in how to exercise those rights and access available support. This could include a signposting service both when placed on pathway and on diagnosis with autism or other neurodivergence, assistance in applying for benefits, blue badges, exceptional needs funding etc and awareness sessions/training on disability rights, e.g Equality Act duties, GDPR, education rights and how to enforce these rights. 5. Title of Project Proposal and Project Summary max two lines (to be used in publicity) Neurodivergent Dance Class To hold accessible dance classes for neurodivergent children and their siblings. 3 classes 2-4 years 4-11 years 12+ years These classes provide a fun, no pressure and no judgement environment for neurodivergent/potentially neuro divergent children and their families to attend. These are hosted by professional dance teachers in a safe environment. In the adjoining room there will be tea, coffee etc set up so parents can support each other or children can have a break from the class. 6. 14. Improve access to the places, spaces and facilities for everyone.

One of our three pillars is inclusion which ties in with the above priority for the Area Partnership Plan.

This project covers two of our pillars - inclusion and support.

It includes the community's neurodivergent children by allowing them to access a class which many of them would not be able to do when presented in a neurotypical way. These classes are provided within Port Seton Community Centre, we provide STAND volunteers to man fire exits to minimise risk of children escaping, provide sensory and OT equipment to allow for regulation, both dance teachers involved have experience with neurodivergent children there for ensure there is no judgement and parents are re assured.

We also provide support for the parents, providing them with free tea, coffee and biscuits to allow them to relax and chat with other parents and carers who have found themselves in similar situations.

Our facebook group currently holds over 2.1k members and our whatsapp support groups around 436 parents/carers. We receive a lot of feedback around children being excluded from classes that are aimed at neurotypical learning. This is due to many of them not understanding instruction and struggling with sensory challenges. We ran two classes as a pilot project and the feedback we have received already shows what a great impact it has made on the community.

12. Our communities are better able to make healthy choices, reduce isolation and access the services they need in order to maintain a positive level of physical and mental health

This project reduce's isolation to families of neurodivergent and potentially neurodivergent children.

COVID had a massive effect on many of these children and their families. Change of routine, lack of visits from speech therapists, occupational therapists etc.

This has left many families isolated and anxious to return to the community. These classes allow the families to come somewhere guaranteed they will not receive any judgement. It gives them a space to meet other people and have a chat.
